

# Mr. Alastair Swarbrick



Mr. Alastair Swarbrick took up the post of the Cayman Islands Auditor General in July 2010 and has overall responsibility for the management and work of the Office of the Auditor General. Mr. Swarbrick has over 20 years experience in public auditing across a variety of sectors and working for a number of organisations. Prior to taking up his current position he was an Assistant Director of Audit with Audit Scotland, where he was the engagement partner for a portfolio of audits and led the Business Improvement Unit which was responsible for developing and managing projects to improve the way that Audit Scotland delivered its work.

He began his career in the Scottish Office before moving to the Accounts Commission for Scotland where he completed his professional accountancy training in 1996, becoming a member of the Chartered Institute of Public Finance and Accountancy.

Mr. Swarbrick subsequently moved to the UK National Audit Office in London taking on various roles before returning to Scotland to work for Audit Scotland as a Senior Audit Manager in December 2001, leading the audit of the Scottish Government, as well as a number of its agencies and health service bodies.

Mr. Swarbrick graduated from the University of Dundee in the UK in 1990 with a Master of Arts, Honours Degree in Economics where he also received the Bowie Memorial Prize for the Most Distinguished Student in Economics.

He was born and raised near Edinburgh, Scotland and is married with two young sons. Away from the office he enjoys watching, but no longer playing, rugby and cricket, and can be found on occasion on the golf course.
