

The Rt. Rev. Dr. Yvette Noble-Bloomfield



The Rev. Bloomfield has served in a wide variety of roles in the United Church, including administrative and mission leadership roles, pastoral care and counselling, school chaplaincy, and radio ministry.

She candidated for the fulltime pastoral ministry in the late 1970s and started her preparation at the United Theological College of the West Indies (UTCWI) in 1979, from which she received a Diploma in Ministerial Studies and a Bachelor's of Theology (Upper Second Class Honours) degree. She also obtained a Certificate in Radio Magazine Format from the University of the West Indies and, in 2001, earned a Doctor of Ministry Degree from the Columbia Theological Seminary, Decatur, Georgia, USA.

In September 2009 she was asked to serve as the United Church's Regional Deputy General Secretary (RDGS). After two years as RGDS, she relocated to Grand Cayman as Director of the Bethesda Counselling Centre. She was called to the Office of Moderator of the United Church in Jamaica and the Cayman Islands in April 2013.

In the field of education, Dr. Yvette Noble-Bloomfield served as part-time lecturer and advisor to the final year students of Jamaica's Institute for Theological and Leadership Development. Over a ten-year span she served in Jamaica as a religious education teacher at St. Andrew High School for Girls, Camperdown High, and Wolmer's High School for Boys. She has also served as Chaplain at Camperdown High and the St. Paul's Basic School.

Her special interests include learning disorders, domestic violence impacts on children, and gender issues. Her concerns extends to environmental issues, including the impact of pollution and the maintenance of green areas. Ethnic and cultural Identity issues have also benefitted from her public expression of concern.

The Rev. Bloomfield is married to Denver, an educator, and they are blessed with two children, Andrew and Francine, currently students at the University of Toronto and York University, Canada, respectively.
